 - > What is free speech? Sharing info via petitions, sign/placards, speech, etc.
 - > What's not allowed? (1) blocking/impeding/disrupting ingress/egress/movement (2) approaching those in line for events/activities (3) amplifying sound (4) endangering public health/safety/welfare
 - > If you see something not allowed find a volunteer wearing a red polo or yellow caution vest.
 - o <u>UArizona's Free UAlert emergency text messaging</u> https://cirt.arizona.edu/ualert/sign-ualert
 - If you see something, say something. Report unattended items/suspicious persons to a volunteer wearing a red
 polo or yellow caution vest, or a Medical Tent
 - o Report lost people/valuables to a Medical Tent, Info Booth, volunteer with a radio or yellow caution vest
