Tom Angleberger

Tom Angleberger is the New York Times bestselling author of the Origami Yoda series and the Flytrap Files series, as well as many other books for kids. He lives with his family in Virginia. His new book is a graphic novel combining poetry and dinosaurs, *Dino Poet*.

Nick Bruel

Nick Bruel is the creator of the New York Times bestselling Bad Kitty series. He lives with his family in Pleasantville, New York along with their sometimes-good-sometimes-bad cats Rose and Noodles. His new graphic novels are *Bad Kitty: Party Animal* and *Bad Kitty Makes a Movie*.

J.C. Cervantes

J.C. is a New York Times best-selling author. Her books for children and young adults have been published in more than twelve countries and appeared on national lists. She has earned multiple awards and recognitions. Her Rick Riordan Presents Storm Runner fantasy series is set in New Mexico and features Maya mythology. Her new middle grade fantasy is *The Daggers of Ire*.

Angela Dominguez

Angela Dominguez is an author/illustrator of books including the beloved Stella Díaz series. His new picturebook is *The Yellow Bus*. He lives near Cincinnati, Ohio, with his wife and rescue dog, Charlie.

Kyle Lukoff

Kyle Lukoff writes books for kids and other people. Before becoming a full-time writer, Kyle worked at five bookstores, in four libraries, for three schools, as two genders, through one intersection: people, and books. Dawn Quigley

Dawn Quigley, citizen of the Turtle Mountain Band of Ojibwe, ND, is an assistant professor. She taught English and reading in K-12 schools and served as an Indian Education program co-director. In addition to her young adult novel, *Apple in the Middle*, she has written the early chapter book series Jo Jo Makoons and the middle grade novel-in-verse *Red Bird Danced*.

Andrea L. Rogers and <u>Rebecca Lee Kunz</u>

Andrea L. Rogers is an award-winning author of historical and contemporary fiction, including essays, picture books, young adult novels, middle grade stories and a comic. Her new YA novel is a Cherokee Futurism called *The Art Thieves* and a new picturebook, *Chooch Helped*.

Rebecca Lee Kunz grew up in Oklahoma and is an artist and the owner of Tree of Life Studio in Santa Fe, NM, where lives with her husband and three daughters. A citizen of the Cherokee Nation, her work draws upon tribal iconography and is inspired by mythic and archetypal symbolism. *Chooch Helped* is her debut picturebook.

Bob Shea

Bob Shea is an award-winning author and illustrator of picturebooks, including the popular Ballet Cat series, The Dinosaur VS. ... series and runaway smash hit, *Unicorn Thinks He's Pretty Great*. He wrote Who Wet My Pants illustrated by his friend Zach Ohora. His new picturebook is *Bearsuit Turtle Makes a Friend*.

Nikkolas Smith and Kwame Mbolia

Nikkolas Smith is an Artivist, picturebook author, and Hollywood film illustrator. He is the author-illustrator of *The Artivist* and *My Hair Is Poofy & That's Okay*. He also illustrated *I Am Ruby Bridges, Wakanda Forever: The Courage to Dream, That Flag,* and *The 1619 Project: Born on the Water*. He is the illustrator of *Captain America*. Nikkolas speaks on his Artivism and leads digital painting workshops. Born in Houston, Texas, Nikkolas lives in Los Angeles.

Kwame Mbalia is a #1 *New York Times* best-selling author and the publisher of Freedom Fire, an imprint of Disney Hyperion devoted to stories about the Black diaspora by Black creators and includes his Jax Freeman series. He is the author of the award-winning Tristan Strong series and the picturebook, *Captain America: Brave New World: A Hero Looks Like You*. Kwame lives with his wife and children outside Raleigh, North Carolina, where he is working on the next Jax Freeman adventure.

SJ Taylor

S. J. Taylor writes stories steeped in folklore and magic, where young protagonists tackle big adventures and bigger questions. Kim Bussing writes fairy tales for children and adults. She has an MFA from the University of Arizona. Her new middle school novel, *Buffalo Dreamer*, was named a 2024 National Book Award for Young People's Literature Finalist. She is also Creative Director at Young Warriors.

Megan E. Freeman attended an elementary school where poets visited her classroom every week and has been a writer ever since. She writes middle grade and young adult fiction. An award-winning teacher, Megan taught multiple subjects across the arts and humanities. Her new middle grade novel is *Away*, a sequel to *Alone*. She lives near Boulder, Colorado.

Leah Johnson

Leah Johnson is an eternal midwesterner and author of award-winning books for children and young adults. Her middle grade novel, *Ellie Engle Saves Herself*, is followed by her new book, *Bree Boyd is a Legend*. Leah edited *Black Girl Power: 15 Stories Celebrating Black Girlhood* under the Freedom Fire imprint. She owns Loudmouth Books, her Indianapolis-based bookstore that specializes in the work of marginalized authors and banned or challenged books.

Rosanne Parry

Rosanne Parry is the author of the bestselling novels *A Wolf Called Wander, A Whale of the Wild, A Horse Named Sky,* and her new book, *A Wolf Called Fire.* These "Voice of the Wilderness" stories center the voices of wild animals and their struggle to survive in a dangerous and changing world. Based on rigorous research and inspired by animals of the western United States, Rosanne's books are adored by animal-loving readers of all ages. The author lives with her family in Portland, Oregon, and writes in a treehouse in her backyard.

Jose Pimienta

Jose Pimienta was raised in Mexicali, Baja California and now resides in Los Angeles, working on comics and storyboards for animation and film. Their middle grade graphic novel, *Twin Cities*, received starred reviews and several awards. Jose's new graphic novel is *Halfway to Somewhere*. Jose has been a guest author at schools across the U.S. Jose focuses on the importance of Latinx culture and the experience of growing up on the border.
