He also published *A Lite Too Bright* and *Dark Paths of the Universe*. Sam wrote his first novel in a fifteen-passenger van while touring with his alt-rock band, Paradise Fears. In addition, he coaches Little League Baseball, walks his dog, and works to dismantle capitalist systems of power.
